The formal documentation was signed in March during a visit by Karen Slevinsky, the Accrediation Consultant from Alberta Education. MSA continues to receive an excellent report on our progress in meeting the outcomes of the Alberta Programs of Study.

This is a tremendous accomplishment and a major milestone in our vision of changing our education system to one that is recognized internationally as being rigorous, measurable and one of the best in the world. It is interesting to note, that while MSA is not the first school outside of Canada to use the Alberta Curriculum, we are a first in being the only school to have transitioned from an existing curriculum. As we are the first, they have taken a keen interest in our success. All who have been involved will attest, the transition has not been without its challenges; change is never easy. The ultimate benefit to our students... to your children, makes it absolutely worth it!

Moving to a standards based educational program allows us to better measure student success. Accessing an outside resource to help us evaluate our progress has provided us with an opportunity to know how we compare outside the Bermuda environment. Now that we have fully transitioned to our new Program of Study, this year holds more opportunities as we begin the Grade 12 Diploma Exams which are set by Alberta Education. The first set was written in January and the next will be written in June. We continue to ensure that teachers are provided with professional development opportunities and other program resources so they can deliver the curriculum at the required standard. Students are receiving tremendous support in preparation for this new experience.

Over the next two months, as the 2012/2013 school year comes to an end, our faculty and staff will be preparing for many activities such as the Prom, final exams, Graduation and welcoming our new Kindergarten students for next year.

I wish to express my appreciation to the MSA community for all of the good wishes and prayers during my absence. A special expression of gratitude is extended to Margaret DiGiacomo for all of the extras that she has done in my absence. I can only express that we should be thankful for the faith we all share!

In closing, I wish you all the very best and look forward to sharing with you more on our continued successes in the next newsletter.

The standardization of outcomes and assessments provides our school with the measures necessary to assist students in their post-secondary admissions and success. With this ongoing support, we will continue to offer our students a world-class education in a safe, nurturing and faith based environment

The MSA Capital Campaign that commenced in 2006 will be concluded at the end of this school year. The Campaign which set a goal of \$5,000,000 was based on a five year pledge program. The total amount pledged was \$5,260,193 and the cash received to date has been \$5,086,559. This is a tremendous achievement and commitment by our donors when considering the economic challenges the Island has had over the last three years. Between now and August 31 we are working hard to collect, and in some cases reconfirm the commitment to pay, the outstanding pledge amount of \$173,634. Before the end of June 30, 2013 we will be erecting a commemorative plaque recognizing the donors of this Campaign. This semester, the Seniors worked with the Grade Two students who had just learned about the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The children were able to

explain to the Grade 12's what Reconciliation meant to them and the Seniors, in turn, wrote stories for them about reconciliation. They returned to the class after the books had been made and the students had the opportunity to read the books to the Seniors. Each book was created with the child in mind but, more
