At the beginning of the school year, we celebrated the successful expansion of the new Bishop Robert J. Kurtz, C.R. Early Learning Centre at MSA! The addition of these state-of-the-art classrooms is a significant and exciting development for the school.

The ribbon cutting ceremony included a blessing from Bishop Wes Spiewak, C.R., and official ribbon cutting by our Board Chair, Sean Kelly '02, P '36. The purpose-built centre, which encompasses classrooms and an outdoor recreation area for the Early Learning Program, Kindergarten, and Grade 1, showcases a commitment to providing a collaborative and engaging learning environment.

The emphasis on the Reggio Emilia approach to learning, collaborative spaces, and interactive workstations reflects a contemporary and student-centered design. Careful consideration was given to creating spaces that encourage creativity, independent learning, and a sense of community.

The addition of an Atelier (early learning art studio) further enhances the learning experience, providing students with a dedicated space to explore and express their creativity.

The new Early Learning Centre allows MSA to meet the growing demand for its Early Learning Program, and we welcomed an additional ELP class this year. We appreciate those who contributed to fundraising efforts for this expansion, including those who attended our Country & Western Gala on April 15. Thank you!

The MSA Canadian Universities and Colleges Tour 2023

It was a whirlwind 10 days in October when 28 Grade 11 and 12 students, accompanied by two chaperones, visited universities and colleges in Maritime Canada and Ontario. In total, 22 postsecondary institutions were toured, including Dalhousie University, Acadia University, University of New Brunswick, Queens University, University of Ontario Institute of Technology, University of Western Ontario, University of Toronto, Sheridan College and University of Guelph.

Students had the opportunity to compare programs, campuses, residences, and cafeterias. Sessions with international recruiters provided information about the programs and the academic requirements.

In addition to the tours, the group visited Niagara Falls, Canada's Wonderland Halloween Haunt and, in true Bermudian fashion, there were a few visits to shopping malls, and multiple trips to Starbucks and Tim Hortons.

Everyone returned from the tour very tired but more equipped to begin the important decision-making process of applying for and selecting a post-secondary school that best fits their goals and preferences.

Bermudians Doing Great Things

Last year a school wide project, focused on inquiry-based learning, cross-curricular projects, and direct applications to the "real-world", was introduced around the theme: Bermudians Doing Great Things. Here are some examples of the projects completed.

Music: The Grade 8 choir and the Grade 10 band performed the song 'Proud to be Bermudian' for the Spring Concert. Ronnie Lopes '76 came to MSA to speak to the students about recording the song with other well-known Bermudian musicians, his experiences with music in Bermuda (and in different countries) and all of the opportunities that are out there in music for young people. He also joined the students in the Spring Concert performance.

Science: Middle school students met with Choy Aming '93 from the Bermuda Zoological Society. Choy spoke to the students about the many great research projects he is working on. Choy spearheaded the Bermuda Shark Project and also assists with many of the ongoing research projects at BAMZ. The students were excited to hear about his close encounters with sharks and the importance of the conservation of these remarkable creatures.

High school students learned about Bermudians researching Bermuda's oceans. Students went to the Aquarium and Trunk Island to research Bermuda's endemic and native species.

Elementary Art: ELP students created a self-portrait project of Bermudians doing great things. They spoke throughout the year about identity, community, and our helping hands. This tied into their religion studies as they discussed taking care of the environment and each other.

Other elementary classes highlighted Bermuda in their art projects on mangroves, bridges, identity, oceans, beaches and Bermuda flora and fauna. Grade 1 hosted an assembly supported by Ms. Horsefield of BUEI (Bermuda Underwater Exploration Institute) and Ecoschools.

Religion: Grade 10 students created masks of Bermudians doing great things. The project was twofold: visual representation on the outside, and the qualities of the individual on the inside of the mask.

Grade 1 students made cards and sent snacks to the residents of Matilda Smith Home for Valentine's Day to honor our elderly Bermudians.

ELA: All middle school students read "Girlcott" by Bermudian Florenz Maxwell. The central theme is based on the 1959 Theatre Boycott to end segregation in Bermuda.

Ocean Warriors: Ocean conservation, a baby longtail health assessment, dolphin habitat and beach clean-up and how plastics impact our marine environment were just some of the activities that students partook in with Jeremy Madeiros, Dolphin Quest. BZS and KBB.
